Who's Who in the Cast and Crew

The Crew:

Mary-Liz Murray (Director) – Mary-Liz is proud to be making her Weston Friendly debut as the director for *Anne of Green Gables*. She has been involved in theater since the ripe old age of 12 and graduated from the University of Connecticut with a BFA in Acting in May of 2008. She currently works as an actor as well as the Assistant to the Managing Director for Company One (in residence at the Boston Center for the Arts) and in the Music Department at Tufts University. Her favorite acting credits include Joy in *Aloha Say the Pretty Girls*, the Stage Manager in *Our Town*, Jo March in *Little Women*, and Catherine in *Proof*. *Anne of Green Gables* marks an exciting return to directing, having last directed the 2004 Massachusetts High School Drama Festival entry, *Girl Town*. Many thanks always to her wonderful friends and unendingly supportive family, but especially to a talented and dedicated cast. “Always for my angel, GRM*.”

Bethany Aiken (Music Director) – Bethany is pleased to return to the Weston Friendly, having appeared in the cast of *Once Upon a Mattress* last spring. She served for two seasons as the assistant music director at the Weathervane Theatre in New Hampshire. Some of her favorite productions include *Hairspray*, *Sweeney Todd*, *Oklahoma*, *Violet* and the regional premiere of *Rent*. As music director for Weathervane’s Intern Program, Bethany wrote original music for *Wizard of Magic Island*, a musical retelling of Shakespeare’s *The Tempest*, as well as *Seussical* and *A Year with Frog and Toad*. Locally, Bethany played keyboard for the Boston premiere of *Jerry Springer: The Opera* (Speakeasy Stage) and

Colleen Grady (Choreographer) – Colleen is thrilled to be making her choreography debut with *Anne of Green Gables*. She has been teaching dance for the last nine years at Sue's Dance Studio in Marlborough and dancing since she was five years old. Currently, Colleen teaches first grade at the Pompositticut School in Stow. She would like to thank her family and friends for all their support. A special thank you to Mary-Liz, Bethany, and the cast for all their hard work and for making her first production such a wonderful experience!

The Cast:

Will Anderson (Charlie Sloane) – Will is currently in the seventh grade at the Weston Middle School. Some of his past productions include The Reagle Players' production of *Joseph and the Amazing Technicolor Dreamcoat*, Weston Drama Workshop's *Once on This Island* and *Charlotte's Web* as well as several other school productions. When not onstage, Will enjoys skiing, rough housing with his two dogs, and playing "Guitar Hero."

Lisa Astley-Sparke (Mrs. Blewett) – Lisa is delighted to be given the opportunity to play the part of Mrs. Blewett – a mother of 10 children! A mother of three, she relocated from London where she operated her own enterprise called "Monkey Business" where she provided musical instruction for children. Her theatrical debut was Nancy in Lionel Bart's *Oliver* at the grand old age of 12. Lisa feels it has been an absolute privilege to work with such a skilled director and cast that possesses such professionalism.

Jane Cunningham (Mrs. Spencer) – Jane made her Weston Friendly debut with her daughter in the 2007 production of *Annie* where she played a Boylan Sister, Frances Perkins, a maid, and a homeless person.
